Remarks

Stylopoma vilaensis is characterised by: its primary orifice, the proximal edge giving a Y-shaped appearance when the sinus and condyles are viewed together; and the frontal shield, which has a small number of pores in it.

Stylopoma vilaensis is possibly the most easily recognised of the Stylopoma species occurring in the Solomon Islands owing to its distinctive orifice.

Distribution

Stylopoma vilaensis has been reported from Indonesia and Vanuatu. A single small colony was found from the docks at Yandina, Mbanika Island, Russell Islands in the Solomon Islands.
